NOTICE OF BOARD ACTION

At its November 7, 2023 meeting at 11:30 am, the Baltimore County Board of Elections reviewed, considered and unanimously approved the Polling Place locations for the 2024 Presidential Election cycle. The meeting was held at the new Baltimore County Board of Elections office in the Multipurpose Room, located at 5 Crossing Way in Owings Mills, Maryland 21117.

With the exception of three (3) locations, the proposed polling place locations included all established locations from the previous election cycle. The relocation of three (3) polling places was necessary. The relocated facilities are better suited to host elections. Listed below are the three (3) relocated polling places with a description and the justification as to why the relocation was necessary. The meeting was held in person, open to the public and was available by livestream for public viewing.

1. 4-09 and 4-16 - Upperco Volunteer Fire Department, Activities Hall located at 16020 Carnival Avenue, Upperco, Maryland 21155 relocated in close proximity to the new Upperco Volunteer Fire Department, in the Meeting Room located at 5500 Fringer Road, Upperco, Maryland 21155. The Fire Department relocated to a new building which made the relocation of the polling place necessary. The relocated polling place is closer to voters, located off of a main road in a convenient location.
2. 4-11 – Butler Volunteer Fire Department, Hall located at 15019 Falls Road relocated to Franklin Middle School in the Gymnasium located at 10 Cockeysmill Road, Reisterstown, Maryland 21136. The relocation was necessary because the Butler Volunteer Fire Department no longer agrees to host elections and there were also issues with the facility. The new location is closer in proximity to the voters it serves, is voter friendly, meets all requirements and is in compliance with all election and ADA laws. Voters will vote closer to their homes and vote in the school that their children attend.
3. 11-15 – Carney Elementary School, Cafeteria located at 3131 E. Joppa Road in Parkville, Maryland 21234 relocated back to the original voting location at the Oakcrest Retirement Community in the Conference Room located at 8810 Walther Boulevard, Parkville, Maryland 21234. Oakcrest Retirement Community underwent renovations and was not available for use in 2022 so a relocation at that time was necessary. The renovations are complete and the facility is available for the 2024 election cycle. Voting at the original location is convenient for voters as it is closer to their homes.
