## CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS REQUIRED FOR DWELLINGS THAT USE FOSSIL FUELS

## REQUIRED FOR DWELLINGS CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMITS ISSUED ON AND AFTER 01/01/2008

House Bill 401, passed by the Md. General Assembly requires the installation of a carbon monoxide alarm in a central location outside of each sleeping area or, under specified circumstances, within 25 feet of any carbon monoxide-producing fixture and equipment within a dwelling; prohibits a person from rendering a carbon monoxide alarm inoperable with a specified exception; requires that a specified disclosure form include specified information about a carbon monoxide alarm under specified circumstances; etc.
