LOOKING AHEAD TO THREE BIG ZONING AND DEVELOPMENT DECISIONS

This fall, the Baltimore County Council will begin tackling three decisions that will impact the course of development over the next decade.

[The first is the adoption of the new Master Plan](#), an aspirational planning document that charts a course for the county throughout the next decade and beyond. The Master Plan identifies general land use priorities; it is adopted every ten years after an intense public engagement process.

[The second big decision is the long-awaited reform of Baltimore County's Adequate Public Facilities Ordinance](#), which regulates development in the county's school districts. This law has been rightfully criticized for allowing growth in areas that cannot accommodate new housing; developers have countered that the Board of Education does not redistrict to address capacity issues. Regardless, the law needs to be reformed, and it will be the focus of attention soon.

Finally, [Baltimore County will begin the Comprehensive Zoning Map Process](#). Each property in Baltimore County has a zoning designation that allows for development of some kind. Propertyowners, community associations, the Planning Board and the County Council all have the ability to raise issues.

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Nearly Ten Miles of Roads to be Resurfaced in Fifth District

Councilman Marks is working to resurface as many local routes as possible. The Department of Public Works recently released a list of nearly ten miles of local roads that will be resurfaced in the Fifth District, from Carney to Middle River. These will be completed over the next construction season, from this summer to next spring.

County Council Passes Bill to Advance Middle River Depot Revitalization



On July 3rd, the Baltimore County Council passed legislation that will continue the redevelopment of the historic Middle River Depot, [now known as Aviation Station](#). This complex to the east of White Marsh Boulevard has been a key part of our country's aviation history, playing an essential role in manufacturing planes during the Second World War. The project is being developed by Reich Brothers.

This legislation advances the redevelopment of the main warehouses. Fire safety systems will be implemented in a way that retains the building's historic structure and character. Councilman Marks thanks Chair Julian Jones, Fire Chief Joanne Rund, and County Executive John Olszewski's staff for their help.
