ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

Restrictions on Parking – Parking on Private Property – Parking Surface

FOR the purpose of moving certain vehicle parking limitations on private property in the Greater Towson area and under certain circumstances from the County Code to the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations; expanding the applicability of such parking limitations on private property ~~to apply county-wide~~; and generally relating to parking.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE

2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Laws of Baltimore County read as follows:

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ARTICLE 18 – TRANSPORTATION

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Title 2 – Vehicles and Traffic

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7 [§ 18-2-215. Restrictions on Parking in Greater Towson.

8 (a) In the area of Greater Towson encompassed within the Towson Precinct (Precinct 6)

9 of the Baltimore County Police Department, a vehicle parked on private property may only be

10 situated on a concrete, asphalt paved, or durable and dustless surface that is intended for the

11 parking of vehicles except for a commercial vehicle otherwise legally parked and only for the

12 period of time essential for the immediate use of the vehicle.

13 (b) A vehicle parked in violation of this section is punishable by a fine of \$75.]

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15 SECTION 2. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE

16 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations read as follows:

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ARTICLE 4 – SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Section 2 – Parking of [Commercial] Vehicles on Residential Property

§ 431.2. RESTRICTIONS ON PARKING ~~IN GREATER TOWSON~~ ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY.

A. A VEHICLE PARKED ON ~~PRIVATE~~ RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY MAY ONLY BE SITUATED ON A CONCRETE, ASPHALT PAVED, OR DURABLE AND DUSTLESS SURFACE THAT IS INTENDED FOR THE PARKING OF VEHICLES EXCEPT FOR A COMMERCIAL VEHICLE OTHERWISE LEGALLY PARKED AND ONLY FOR THE PERIOD OF TIME ESSENTIAL FOR THE IMMEDIATE USE OF THE VEHICLE.

B. SECTION 431.2 APPLIES ONLY TO RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES LOCATED EAST OF CHARLES STREET, SOUTH AND WEST OF I-695, NORTH AND EAST OF THE BALTIMORE CITY-BALTIMORE COUNTY LINE, AND NORTHWEST OF PHILADELPHIA ROAD AND ITS MERGER WITH PULASKI HIGHWAY TO THE CITY-COUNTY LINE.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect 14 days from the date of its enactment.
