A BILL
ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

Zoning Regulations - Tattoo Establishments

FOR the purpose of permitting certain tattoo or body piercing establishments to relocate in certain zones
under certain circumstances, and generally relating to tattoo or body piercing establishments.

BY repealing and re-enacting, with amendments

Section 6 of Bill 29-98 as amended by Bill 46-06

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE COUNTY,
2 MARYLAND, that Section 6 of Bill 29-98, as amended by Bill 46-06, be and is hereby repealed and
3 re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

1 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act does not apply to a massage
2 establishment or tattoo or body piercing establishment in existence in a business or commercial zone
3 for at least 12 months prior to the effective date of this Act except if a massage establishment or tattoo
4 or body piercing establishment relocates, other than a tattoo establishment that relocates within a BM-
5 CCC District that is less than 500 feet removed from its earlier location OR THAT RELOCATES
6 FROM A LOCATION WITHIN 1,000 FEET OF A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SCHOOL TO A
7 LOCATION WITHIN A BL, BM, OR BR ZONE WHICH IS FURTHER REMOVED FROM A
8 PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SCHOOL, BUT LESS THAN 1,000 FEET REMOVED FROM ITS
9 EARLIER LOCATION. This section is not intended to waive any other provision or requirement of
10 state or county law in effect prior to the effective date of this Act.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by the
12 affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect October 16, 2011.
