



BALTIMORE COUNTY POLICE ACCOUNTABILITY BOARD MEETING MINUTES

MEETING #10 – OCTOBER 16, 2023 @ 12:00 PM

ROOM 118, HISTORIC COURTHOUSE AND VIA WEBEX

Call to Order:

- Linda Shields (Chair- District 2) called the meeting of the Baltimore County Police Accountability Board to Order at 12:10 p.m.

Roll Call:

- Peter Fitzpatrick (District 1) and Linda Shields (Chair-District 2) appeared in person. John Chambers (District 4), Renee Streib (District 5), Scott Richman (District 6), Elizabeth Dishon-Feuer (District 7) and Nigeria Rolling- Ford (At-Large) appeared via WebEx. Bishop Ralph Dennis (District 3) and Kara White (At-Large) were absent.
- Henry Callegary and Kelly La Valley were in attendance from the Baltimore County Administrative Office.

Approval of Minutes:

- Scott Richman (District 6) moved to approve the minutes of the September 18, 2023 Baltimore County Police Accountability Board meeting. The motion was seconded by Elizabeth Dishon-Feuer (District 7).
- The motion was approved unanimously.

New Business:

- Henry Callegary provided background on the appointment of Trial Board members.
- Linda Shields (Chair-District 2) moved that the Baltimore County Police Accountability Board appoint Wesley Bohle to serve as a primary civilian member, Anthony Kish as a first alternate civilian member and Gary Tosadori as a second

alternate civilian member of the November 13th and 14th 2023 Trial Board, called by the Maryland Department of Health Police Force. The motion was seconded by Peter Fitzpatrick (District 1).

- The motion was approved unanimously.
- Scott Richman (District 6) moved the Baltimore County Police Accountability Board appoint, Bernadette White and James Hollis Albert to serve on the Baltimore County Trial Board roster. The motion was seconded by Elizabeth Dishon-Feuer (District 7).
- The motion was approved unanimously.

Updates from the October 13, 2023 Administrative Charging Committee meeting:

- Elizabeth Dishon-Feuer (District 7) gave an update on the Administrative Charging Committee's October 13, 2023 meeting. There was one investigatory file, which was a use of force complaint. The officer was not administratively charged and was exonerated. There are no pending cases. The next meeting is on November 3, 2023 at 1:00 p.m., Room #118, Historic Courthouse and via WebEx.
- Henry Callegary clarified that while there are no pending cases for review, there are complaints pending.

Update on Annual Report:

- At the November 20, 2023 Baltimore County Police Accountability Board meeting the Annual Report will be reviewed. The final adoption vote for the annual report is at the December 18, 2023 meeting.

Public Comment:

- A member of the public ("Bianca") appeared at the meeting via WebEx and asked about the prior Baltimore County Administrative Charging Committee meeting being "locked," as well as inquiring about the ability of a complainant to appeal a Baltimore County Administrative Charging Committee decision. Henry Callegary responded that the Baltimore County Administrative Charging Committee would ensure members of the public can attend the public session of meetings, and that the Baltimore County Police Accountability Board cannot provide legal advice to a member of the public. Linda Shields (Chair-District 2) noted that while the comments were appreciated, the Baltimore County Police Accountability Board could not speak to the Baltimore County Administrative Charging Committee's practices and decisions.

- Linda Shields (Chair-District 2) added as a reminder that the next Baltimore County Police Accountability Board meeting is on November 20, 2023 at 12:00 p.m., Room #118, Historic Courthouse or via WebEx.
