



**EXECUTIVE ORDER  
No. 2021-018**

**SUNNYBROOK WATER RATE**

WHEREAS, under Article 20 (Metropolitan District), Section 20-3-206 of the Baltimore County Code, 2015, the County Executive is charged with the duty of fixing charges for water services furnished to residents of Sunnybrook; and

WHEREAS, since the Sunnybrook water system was installed in 1965, revenues from users of the system have fallen below the County's costs in operating and maintaining the system; and

WHEREAS, it is evident that an increase in the Sunnybrook water rate is justified and necessary to offset increased County costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 20-3-206 of the Baltimore County Code, 2015 and Section 307(b) of the Baltimore County Charter and consistent with the provisions of Chapter 539 of the Laws of Maryland, 1924, as amended, known as "The Metropolitan District Act", it is this 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 2021, ORDERED as follows:


SECTION 1: Effective for all water consumption after June 30, 2021, the Sunnybrook water rate is hereby established at FOUR DOLLARS AND FOURTY-SIX CENTS (\$4.46) per 1,000 gallons of consumption and the minimum charge per account per quarter is hereby established at THIRTY-THREE DOLLARS AND THIRTY-SEVEN CENTS (\$33.37).

SECTION 2: The charges set forth in Section 1 above shall continue in force and effect until changed by further Executive Order.

SECTION 3: All previous Orders, Resolutions, or policy decisions pertaining to Sunnybrook water rates in force at the time of the Order are hereby repealed to the extent of any inconsistency with the provisions of this Order.
